

Hunter/Equitation Prize List

Subject to any specific cross entering rules of a given class – Same Horse/Rider combination is limited to entering a maximum of two divisions per day in any Hunter Arena. Same Horse/Rider combination in Novice/Pony ring A horse or pony may only enter a maximum of 3 o/f divisions per day.

NOVICE/PONY RING:

Warm Up classes: May cross enter to ANY warm up classes in Hunter Ring #1. Ribbons only. No year end awards. No points. Class will be open at respective height until next height change.

Lead Line Equitation: For junior riders 8 y/o and under who have not competed in any other classes at any horse show. Riders are ineligible for any other class at this show. “Trot” class: At judge’s discretion, one at a time, rider w/handler to trot a few steps demonstrating posting (**no diagonals**). Exhibitors’ option to not trot is not to be cause for elimination. To be judged on the fundamentals of horsemanship and suitability of mount to child. Protective headgear and correct shoes or boots with heels are required.

Walk-Trot Hunter 8 and Under: Open to riders 8 years old and under. Riders jump one cross-rail in one class. To be judged on manners, suitability and way of going. *Same Horse/rider combination MAY NOT cross enter into any other classes on same show day.*

Walk Trot Hunter 9 and over: Open to riders 9 years of age and older. Same specifications as Walk Trot Hunter 8 and Under.

Walk Trot Equitation: Same specifications as Walk Trot Hunter with additional emphasis on rider’s equitation. *Same Horse/rider combination MAY NOT cross enter to any other classes on same show day.*

“The Tackeria” Cross Rails Hunter 12 and Under: Open to riders 12 years of age and under. To jump a simple course of 8 cross rails. Rider **MUST** trot into each line, but may canter down the line to the second jump. If rider trots down the line, diagonals are not be penalized between jumps in the line. Under Saddle to be judged at the walk and trot only. To be judged on manner, suitability and way of going with additional emphasis on rider’s equitation in equitation classes.

Rider MAY NOT cross enter to any other classes on same show day.

Cross Rails Equitation 12 and Under: Same specifications as Cross Rails Hunter 12 and under with additional emphasis on rider’s equitation. *Rider MAY NOT cross enter to any other classes on same show day.*

“ESP Inc.” Cross Rails Hunter 13 and Over: Open to riders 18 years of age and older. To jump a simple course of 8 cross rails. Rider **MUST** trot into each line, but may canter down the line to the second jump. If rider trots down the line, diagonals are not to be penalized between the jumps in the line. Under Saddle to be judged at the walk and trot only. To be judged on manner, suitability, and way of going with additional emphasis on rider’s equitation in equitation classes.

Rider MAY NOT cross enter to any other classes on same show day.

Cross Rails Equitation 13 and Over: Same specifications as Cross Rails Hunter 13 and over with additional emphasis on rider’s equitation. ***Rider MAY NOT cross enter to any other classes on same show day.***

“On Course Consignment” Short Stirrup Hunter 12 & under: Riders in this class must not have reached their 13th birthday. Rider **MAY NOT** cross enter to any other O/F on same show weekend except the Lyn Walton Medal class. To jump a simple course of 18”. To be judged on manners, suitability and way of going. Simple lead changes or trot steps are not to be penalized. ***Rider MAY NOT cross enter to any other o/f classes on same show day.***

Short Stirrup Equitation 12 & under: Same specifications as Short Stirrup Hunter except rider’s equitation to be emphasized. ***Rider MAY NOT cross enter to any other o/f classes on same show day.***

Lyn Walton Memorial Medal: Same specifications as Short Stirrups Equitation. Top 4 riders may test at judge’s discretion (USEF tests 1-9 only).

Long Stirrup Hunter 13 & Over: Open to riders aged 13 and over. To jump a simple course of 18”. Manners and suitability to be emphasized. Simple lead changes or trot steps are not to be penalized. No professionals. ***Rider MAY NOT cross enter to any other o/f classes on same show day.***

Long Stirrup Equitation 13 & Over: Same specifications as Long Stirrup Hunter with additional emphasis on rider’s equitation. ***Rider MAY NOT cross enter to any other o/f classes on same show day.***

Small/Medium Pony Hunter- Open to junior riders who have not reached their 18th birthday. Manners and suitability to be emphasized. To jump a course at 2”. ***Same horse/rider combination may not cross enter to o/f exceeding 2’ on same show day.***

“Barn Rat LLC” Small/Medium Pony Equitation- Same specification as Sm/Med hunter with additional emphasis on rider’s Equitation.

“Santaire” Jr/Adult Amateur Hunter 2’: Open to all amateur riders. To jump a course at 2’. Manners and suitability to be emphasized. Simple lead changes or trot steps are NOT to be penalized. No professionals. ***Rider MAY NOT cross enter to any other o/f classes exceeding 2’ on same show day.***

“PBC Sports Commission” Jr/Adult Equitation 2’: Same specifications as Jr./Adult Amateur Hunter with additional emphasis on rider’s equitation. *Rider MAY NOT cross enter to any other o/f classes exceeding 2’ on same show day.*

Open Hunter 2’: Open to all riders and all horses/ponies. To jump a course at 2’. Manner and suitability to be emphasized. Same horse/rider combination may not cross enter to any other o/f exceeding 2’ on same show day.

“Charles Moorcroft” 2’ Pony Medal: Open to junior riders who have not reached their 18th birthday. To jump a course at 2’. Top 4 riders may be tested. Same horse/rider combination may NOT enter any other division or class exceeding 2’.

Open Hunter 2’3”: Open to all riders and all horses/ponies. To jump a course at 2’3” Same horse/rider combination may not cross enter to any o/f exceeding 2’3” on same show day.

"Delray Equestrian Center" Children’s Horse or Pony Hunter: Open to riders who have not reached their 14th birthday. To jump a course of 2’3”. Manners and suitability to be emphasized. Same horse/rider combination may not cross enter to o/f classes exceeding 2’3” on same show day.

“Charles W. Miller” Children’s Horse and Pony Equitation: Same specifications as Children’s Horse or Pony Hunter except rider’s equitation to be emphasized.

“Carriage Hill” 2’3” Medal: Open to junior riders who have not yet reached their 14th birthday. To jump an equitation course of 2’3”. Top 4 riders may be tested. Same horse/rider combination may not cross enter to an O/F exceeding 2’3” on the same show day.

Advanced Ring:

Warm Up classes: May cross enter to ANY warm up classes in Advanced ring. Ribbons only. No year end awards. No points. Class will be open at respective height until next height change.

“Danzig Brothers LLC” Pleasure Horse U/S: Open to all amateur and professional riders. Judging emphasis is on the horse. To show at the walk, trot, canter in both directions. Ribbons ONLY. No points, NO year end award.

“ESP Inc.” Baby Green Hunter: Open to horses in their 1st year of showing or those newly returning to competition. Open to all riders. To jump a course at 2’3”. Same horse/rider combination MAY NOT cross enter to O/F classes exceeding 2’3” on same show day.

“Pinehurst Stables” Low Jr/Adult Amateur Hunter 2’3”: Open to Junior and Adult Amateur riders only. To jump a course at 2’3”. Same horse/rider combination may not cross enter to O/F classes exceeding 2’3” on same show day. Manners and suitability to be emphasized.

Low Jr. /Adult Amateur Equitation 2’3”: Same specifications as Low Jr. /Adult Amateur Hunter with additional emphasis on rider’s equitation.

Large Pony Hunter- Open to large ponies and junior riders who have not reached their 18th birthday. Manners and suitability to be emphasized. To jump a course at 2’6”. Same horse/rider combination may NOT cross enter to any o/f class exceeding 2’6” on same show day except the “Heads Up Media” Handy Hunter Challenge.

Large Pony Equitation: Same specifications as Large Pony Hunter with additional emphasis on rider’s equitation.

“Little Brook Farms, Inc.” Pony Medal 2’6”: Open to junior riders who have not reached their 18th birthday. To jump a course of 2’6”. Top 4 riders may be tested. Same horse/rider combination may not enter any o/f class exceeding 2’6” on same show day, except the “Heads Up Media” Handy Hunter Challenge”.

“MMI of the Palm Beaches” Low Hunter 2’6”: To jump a course of 2’6”. Open to professionals and non-professionals. Same horse/rider combination may not cross enter to o/f classes exceeding 2’6” on same show day except the “All Tied up Handy Hunter Challenge. To be judged on manners and suitability.

“Margaux Grossman” Low Children’s Hunter 2’6”: Open to junior riders who have not reached their 18th birthday. To jump a course of 2’6”. Same horse/rider combination may not cross enter where fences exceed 2’6” on same show day except the “Heads Up Media” Handy Hunter Challenge. Manners and suitability to be emphasized.

“Silver Spring Thoroughbred Management” 17 & Under Equitation: Same specifications as Children’s Hunter w/additional emphasis on rider’s equitation.

Dee Parker Memorial Medal: Open to junior riders under 18 years of age. To jump a course of not less than eight obstacles at 2’6”. Top four may test, USEF Tests 1-19. Same horse/rider combination may not cross enter to O/F exceeding 2’6” on same show day except the “Heads Up Media” Handy Hunter Challenge.

“RCI Painting” Adult Amateur Hunter 2’6”: Open to adult amateur riders 18 years and older only. To jump a course of 2’6”. Manners and suitability to be emphasized. Same horse/rider combination may not cross enter to o/f classes exceeding 2’6” on same show day except the “Heads Up Media” Handy Hunter Challenge.

“Millpond Farm” Adult Amateur Equitation 2’6”: To jump a course of 2’6”. Same specifications as Ad/Am Hunter with additional emphasis on rider’s equitation.

“Hunter’s View” Adult Medal: Open to rider 18 years and older. To jump a course of not less than eight obstacles at 2’6”. Top 4 riders may test, USEF tests 1-19. Same horse/rider combination not eligible to cross enter to any O/F exceeding 2’6” on same show day except the “Heads Up Media” Handy Hunter Challenge.

Open Hunter 2’9”: Open to both professional and non-professional riders. To jump a course of 2’9”. Manners and suitability to be emphasized. Same horse/rider combination not eligible to cross enter any O/F exceeding 2’9” same show day.

PBCHA Jr/Adult Equitation 2’9”: To jump a course at 2’9”. Same specifications as Open Hunter 2’9” with additional emphasis on rider’s equitation.

\$250 “Heads Up Media” Handy Hunter 2’9” Challenge: Open to both professional and amateur riders. Open to any horse/rider combination jumping 2’6” or higher. To jump a handy hunter course at 2’9”. Manners and suitability to be emphasized. Top 10 scoring horses from shows in April, May, June, August, September and October will qualify to compete at the October Show for PRIZE MONEY. Class fee is \$20. \$5 of this fee will go into a “pot” in addition to \$250 donated by “Heads Up Media” Prize money will be distributed at the October show as follows: 1st: 40%, 2nd: 30%, 3rd: 20%, 4th: 10%

“Meadowbrooks Transport” Working Hunter 3’ or 3’3”: Open to professionals and non-professionals. To jump a course of 3’ or 3’3”. Rider’s choice of height. Rider MUST tell Ring Steward height to jump before division starts.. Manners and suitability to be emphasized.

“Montoga Inc.” Junior/Adult Amateur Hunter 3’: Open to junior and adult amateur riders. To jump a course of 3’ or 3’3”. Rider’s choice of height. Steward height to jump. Manners and suitability to be emphasized.

“FAU Equestrian Team” Junior/Adult Equitation 3’ or 3’3”: To jump a course of 3’ or 3”. Rider’s choice of height. Rider MUST tell Ring Steward desired height to jump before the division starts. Same specifications as Jr/Adult Amateur Hunter with additional emphasis on rider’s equitation.

“Tulocay Farm” Medal: Open to junior and adult amateur riders. To jump at least 8 obstacles at 3’. Top four may test, USEF Tests 1-19.

PBCHA ANNOUNCES MARSHALL & STERLING **LEAGUE QUALIFYING CLASSES**

Farnum Adult Medal 3'

Open to Adult Amateur Riders. To be shown over a minimum of 8 fences at 3' including a combination and at least two changes of direction after the first fence. Two or more tests of the top four competitors are required. The same horse must be used in all phases. Only one rider per horse. Three riders must complete the course in order for points to count. The rider must be a member in order for points to count toward qualifying for the Finals.

Marshall & Sterling Children's Medal – Horse 3':

Open to Junior riders on horses that are not competing in any hunter or equitation class in which the fences exceed 3'3". To be shown over a minimum of 8 fences at 3'ft including a combination and at least two changes of direction after the first fence. Two or more tests of the top four competitors are required. The same horse must be used in all phases. Only one rider per horse. Three riders must complete the course in order for points to count. The rider must be a member in order for points to count toward qualifying for the Finals. No cross entry of rider into the M&S Children's pony medal at the same show.

Marshall & Sterling Child/Adult Hunter 3' Classic: Open to juniors and adult amateurs. May ride more than once horse. To jump a course at 3'. Manners and suitability to be emphasized. Marshall & Sterling scoring is the second round of the division combined with your Marshall & Sterling classic. A total overall classic score will then be given. This is a qualifying class towards M & S finals. Rider does not need to be a member to compete, but only horses ridden by M & S members will have their points recorded. Three riders need to complete course for points to count.

Marshall & Sterling Small/Medium Pony Medal: Open to junior riders on Small or Medium ponies. Fences are not to exceed 2ft in height. To be shown over a minimum of 8 fence course with at least two changes of direction after the first fence. Test the top 4 riders are required. Same pony must be used in all phases. Only one rider per pony. Three riders must complete the course in order for points to count. The rider must be a member in order for points to count toward qualifying for the Finals. No cross entry of rider into the M & S Children's Horse Medal at the same show.

Marshall & Sterling Sm/Med Pony Hunter Classic: Open to small/medium ponies and junior riders who have not reached their 18th birthday. Manners and suitability to be emphasized. To jump a course at 2'. Same horse/rider combination may not cross enter to o/f exceeding 2' on same show day. Marshall & Sterling scoring is the second round of the division combined towards your Marshall & Sterling classic. A total overall classic score will then be given. This is a qualifying class towards M & S finals. Rider does not need to be a member to compete, but only horses ridden by M & S members will have their points recorded. Three riders need to complete course for points to count.

Marshall & Sterling Large Pony Hunter Classic: Open to large ponies and junior riders who have not reached their 18th birthday. Manners and suitability to be emphasized. To jump a course at 2'6". Same horse/rider combination may NOT cross enter to any o/f class exceeding 2/6" on same show day except the "All Tied Up Handy Hunter Challenge." Marshall & Sterling scoring is the second round of the division combined towards your Marshall & Sterling classic. A total overall classic score will be given. This is a qualifying class towards M & S finals. Rider does not need to be a member to compete, but only horses ridden by members will have their points recorded. Three riders must complete course for points to count.

Marshall & Sterling Large Pony Medal: Open to all Junior riders on Large ponies that are not competing at the same show in any hunter or equitation class in which the fences exceed 3'3. To be shown over a minimum of 8 fences at the required height with at least two changes of direction after the first fence. Test the top four competitors are required. The same pony must be used in all phases. Only one rider per pony. Three riders must complete the course in order for points to count. The rider must be a member in order for points to count toward qualifying for the Finals. No cross entry of rider into the Marshall & Sterling Horse Medal at the same show.

Marshall & Sterling Bit O Straw- Open to Junior, Adult riders to jump two separate 2'6 courses. Three riders must complete course for points to count. The rider need not be a member to compete but only horse ridden by members will have their point recorded.
